- 2. **SCC Waiver:** The SCC Waiver Request for an extra professional development day was voted on by all bargaining unit 5 members. Garret shared the results of this to be 100% in favor of the Waiver Day.
- 3. **CNA Updates:** Garret shared updates regarding our Certified Needs Assessment (CNA). Garret shared the process the ART uses to come up with prioritized needs and their root causes that will be addressed in our Academic Plan. Some of the root causes were in the areas of: vertical articulation, technology, intervention, instruction and school-wide practices.
- 4. **Salaried Financial Plan:** Garret shared that we will be able to keep all staff members that are currently at JES for SY 24-25. We are still awaiting CAS's approval.

Updates from Role Groups:

<u>Admin:</u> Peace Garden plaques are mounted near the peace pole, lemon tree and garden beds. New Marquee has been delivered and will be installed in the front campus to replace the old one. Capital Improvement Project (CIP) funding has been diverted to support the immense loss from the wildfires on Maui. School's should expect to receive less than expected due to diversion of funds.

Certificated: Genki Project completed. All students in grades K-5 were able to participate. There is a noticeable difference in the cleanliness and amount of fish and other wildlife that has returned. Grade 4/5 Spelling Bee was held on 12/11/23 and the top two 5th grade winners will advance to the district spelling bee in January. Pajamarama Literacy Night was held on 12/8/23. The turnout was huge! Families enjoyed hearing stories told by our principal and students and were engaged in literacy games, activities and crafts. We are planning to hold a STEM Night in February to culminate our STEM Week.

Shop with a Cop was held and 6 students were able to go and shop for gifts of their choice out of a given budget. Police Meet and Greet was held as members of HPD brought their vehicles on campus for the students to see.
