Our classroom teachers and support TEAMs have returned back to our campus and have prepared their classrooms with a print rich environment that will soon be full of samples of student work. Our office TEAM has been working hard to process student registration packets so that our students may begin school on August 02, 2022.

At this year's Educator Leadership Institute (July 19, 2022), Superintendent Hayashi delivered his keynote address. "Neepapa – Educating our Future" was the theme for this school year. At our Honolulu District Educational Leadership Institute (July 25, 2022), the theme of "Neepapa" was reinforced. Each school was asked to utilize **HMTSS** (Hawaii Multi-Tiered System of Support) to ensure that all students are being supported in some way, shape, and/or form. Each school was also asked to provide **SEL** (Social-Emotional Learning) as an additional layer of support.

All of our Kaimuki Complex schools will be meeting on August 26, 2022 for a complex waiver day. This waiver day will focus on "Neepapa", BREATH, HMTSS, SEL, and our English Learners program.

We are looking forward to building off of least years themes of "Weaving our Lei of ALOHA". The needle and thread of our lei are represented by our school's vision and mission. What's Been Going on at JES?

Enrichment Classes for School Year 2022-2023

Enrichment classes provides weekly instruction to all of our students at JES. STEM instruction is provided on a weekly basis. All other enrichment classes are offered once a week on a two-week rotational schedule. Our enrichments classes are comprised of:

- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics)
 - Miss Paradise (grades K-2)
 - Miss Krieger (grades 3-5)
- Health and Physical Education
 - Mr. Didonato (grades K-5)
- Hawaiian Studies
 - Mr. Albarado (grades K-5)
- Keyboarding and Digital Media
 - Miss Wong (grades K-5)
- Social and Emotional Learning
 - Miss Lum (grades K-5)

Enrichment allows all students to be provided with opportunities to be "prepared top constructively participate in the society of their time" (JES vision statement) and to make sure that JES is a "place where we are committed t developing the whole child" (JES mission statement.

Enrichment classes are held on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday beginning the week of **August 15, 2022**. This is a two-hour block of time that is dedicated towards providing a well-rounded education. This two-hour block of time also allows our grade level classroom teachers to met for their weekly articulation/data TEAM meetings.

Celebrating 90 Years

This school year will be our 90th year of educating the keiki of Hawaii . Throughout the school year, we will celebrate out 90th birthday.
